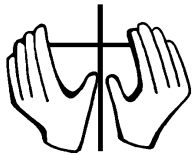

PASTOR’S PARAGRAPH

This paragraph was taken from St. Sebastian’s bulletin concerning the translation of the Sacramentary (the book that contains the prayers of the Mass) which will be coming out in about a year.

Some people will welcome these changes with joy, some with frustration. In any case, it will not be without some discomfort as we struggle to become comfortable with it. However, we hope that when the process begins you will not be taken unawares.

It is interesting to note that this rewriting of our sacred texts is not taking place (at least on this scale) in non-English speaking countries. This is because when the Sacramentary was translated into their languages they already had a much more literal translation. So when you hear Mass in the vernacular of the non-English speaking country the already translated, “Dominus vobiscum-et cum spiritu tuo” as “The Lord be with you, and with your spirit.”

What happened in English speaking countries is that we went for a “dynamic equivalency” rather than a “formal equivalency.” This means that instead of translating the Latin word for word or as closely as possible, we have a translation that feels the same or that is supposed to give the same impression. What we will be experiencing then, in this new translation, is not a “turning back of the clock” as much as that we will coming into line with what the rest of the non-English speaking world is doing and has been doing since Vatican II.
