PASTOR’S PARAGRAPH

Some of the biggest dilemmas occur around end of life issues. The first issue is whether the treatment is burdensome or the person being treated is burdensome. No one has to undergo burdensome treatment or treatments that have little hope of success. This can happen if the treatment would clearly be futile. For example if death is imminent because of the advancing disease, feeding tubes, extra medicine or operations are futile according to the best advice of the doctor and so do not have to be carried out. However, under normal conditions feeding tubes and pain reducing drugs provide reasonable care and are a sign of love for the patient. Patients can’t be denied reasonable care because they are a burden to someone else.

Do Not Resuscitate directives (called DNR’s) and Living Wills are potentially problematic. There has to be a determination whether a person is in a terminal phase or whether treatment could be a bridge to healing. A person needs to make these decisions on the spot as opposed to a document written ahead of time without regard to present circumstances. That is why a “health care proxy” should always be chosen to make the decision. Naturally the proxy makes the decision based on the doctor’s diagnosis and good moral directives.

People should die from an underlying or active disease rather than an imposed starvation or dehydration. People should always choose ordinary treatment rather than die without doing anything. On the other hand disproportional or extraordinary treatments are optional and do not have to be chosen.

The International Task Force on Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide from Stuebenville, Ohio, can help you with any questions you may regarding Advance Directives such as “Durable Power of Attorney”, “Living Wills”, etc., from the Catholic view. They can be reached at 740-282-3810.
