**TAKE THE FIRST STEP**

The Cleveland Diocese Tribunal is presenting the First Step Program (*Quick Start the Annulment Process*) at four locations. This workshop is offered to reach out to those whose marriage, for whatever reason or circumstances, may not be valid in the Church. Even if it has been many years, all are invited and encouraged to attend and, hopefully, begin the process of re-establishing full communion with the sacramental life of the Church.

This user-friendly program has successfully provided individuals with a simplified method for the initial presentation of an annulment case to the Tribunal. The program consists of two sessions. The first meeting will be a general overview of marriage as understood by the Catholic Church and an explanation of the Tribunal process. Individuals who would like to submit a case to the Tribunal using the First Step Program will be given the appropriate materials at the conclusion of the first meeting. Pre-registration for the first meeting is not necessary—just walk in.

**PASTOR’S PARAGRAPH**

Every year each parish in the Diocese must submit an annual report. In addition to this we must submit an report called the “Status Animarum” which comes from the Latin word meaning “state” of “condition of souls”. Some of the information is for use of the diocese, while some of it s required by Rome and is so compiled and sent on.

Most of the report is concerned with sacramental and pastoral ministry. I thought you might be interested to know about some of the significant numbers. We currently have 693 families registered representing 2,154 parishioners.

This past year (which ended June 30, 2010) we celebrated 20 baptisms, 34 first communions, 24 confirmations, 19 weddings, and 13 funerals.
